Sadly, all the names of the freedom fighters of 1857 deported to the Andamans are not available, but a few of them have come to light through the official record in the archives or memoirs and biographies of the individuals. Two names are, however, mentioned in Dr. J.P Walker's letter to the Government of India in 1858.

Sir Hugh Rose came to capture the city of Jhansi in March 1858 but, the brave Lakshmi Bai announced to fight for freedom instead to surrender.
