Role strain, defined by Goode as the "felt difficulty in fulfilling role obligations," has been explored as a potential obstacle for men entering nursing.¹⁵ In a descriptive study of 20 female and 20 male baccalaureate nursing students on maternal/newborn units, Callister and colleagues found that male nursing students had higher levels of role strain than female students, as measured on the Sherrod Role Strain Scale, designed to identify "conflict between gender behavior and behavior ...
