The term urban local government in India signifies the governance of an urban area by the People through their elected representatives. The jurisdiction of an urban local government is limited to a specific Urban area which is demarcated for this purpose by the State Government. 74 th Constitutional Amendment Act, 1992.

Since 1992, local government in India (bala)takes place in two very distinct forms. Urban localities, covered in the 74th amendment to the Constitution, have Nagar Palika but derive their powers from the individual state governments, while the powers of rural localities have been formalized under the panchayati raj system, under the 73rd amendment to the Constitution. Type of urban governments. There are eight types of urban governments in India. Municipal Corporation: Municipal corporations are created for the administration of big cities like Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad and others. A Municipal Corporation has three authorities namely, the council (legislative wing of the corporation), the standing committee (to facilitate the working of the council) and the commissioner (chief executive authority of the corporation).The council consist of councillors ...

The roots of municipal administration in India can be traced to 1687, when a Municipal Corporation was set up at Madras with a view to transfer the financial burden of local administration to the local City Council. Later, the Royal Charter of 1720 established a Mayor’s Court in each of the three Presidency towns of Madras, Bombay and Calcutta.

In order to provide for a common framework for urban local bodies and help to strengthen the functioning of the bodies as effective democratic units of self-government, Parliament enacted the Constitution (74 th Amendment) Act, 1992 relating to municipalities in 1992. The Act received the assent of the President on 20 April 1993.

In 1919, a Government of India Act incorporated the need of the resolution and the powers of democratically elected government were formulated. In 1935 another Government of India act brought local government under the preview of the state or provincial government and specific powers were given. According to the 2001 Census of India, there were 3723 urban local bodies (ULBs) in the country; classified into the four major categories: Municipal corporation (Nagar Nigam) (नगर निकाय)

Urban Local Government: Constitutional Provisions The Constitution (74th Amendment) Act, 1992 inserted new Part- IX A to the Constitution of India. It is entitled as ‘The Municipalities’ and consists of Articles 243-P to 243-ZG. Additionally, the act has also added Twelfth Schedule that contains 18 functional items of municipalities.

Urban Local Bodies - Municipalities In India - 74th Amendment

The foundation of the present local self-government in India was laid by the Panchayati Raj System (1992). But the history of Panchayati Raj starts from the self-sufficient and self-governing village communities. In the time of the Rig-Veda (1700 BC), evidence suggests that self-governing village bodies called ‘sabhas’ existed.

In addition to the area- based urban bodies (or multipurpose agencies, that is, municipal corporations, municipalities, notified area committees, town area committees, cantonment boards, townships and port trusts), the state governments have set up certain agencies to undertake designated activities or specific functions which legitimately, belong to the domain of municipal corporations or municipalities or other local urban governments.
